Who you will help

We support asylum-seekers, refugees and diverse young people. Through our work, we aim to achieve meaningful social change by developing resilient communities.

We work with women from refugee and asylum seeker backgrounds:

- 92% are facing deportation
- 38% are disabled
- 15% have faced domestic violence
- 10% are destitute

Young people from diverse backgrounds:

- 93% are Black, Asian or minority ethnic
- 78% from refugee or asylum seeker background
- 10% are homeschooled
- 5% are disabled

"When you first arrive in the UK and you can't speak English it is a big problem. You don't know the law and you don't know how to cope. Some asylum seekers arrive and are sent straight to a detention centre but they have no idea why. They can't speak English so don't understand what is happening.

A lot of asylum seekers and refugees are very anxious and very depressed. But groups like Afrocats help people and are kind to them."

Fundraising ideas

We like you and your students to bring your own unique ideas for fundraising but we're on hand to help you with ideas for how you can get going. We'll work flexibly with you to meet your fundraising ambitions.

Nominate us as your charity of the year

The whole school community can get involved with fundraising for Afrocats as your charity of the year. You'll get to see the impact of your fundraising with updates throughout the year or the term.

Dress up or dress down

Pick a Friday and hold a dress-up or dress-down day. Dress up as your favourite character, artist or country.

Raffle and a bake sale

Raffle off prizes that you've made or sourced from local businesses. You could also make cakes and sweet treats to sell on the day.

Collection boxes

Keep a collection box on your school reception desk or in the staff room.

Movie day

Pick movies from different cultures to screen in school, charge a ticket entry fee and sell popcorn or other treats.

Donate goods or products

We regularly need donations of toiletries, clothing, period products, laptops or tablets, data. Why not keep a collection bin in school.



Wellbeing boxes

The women we work with have often fled from war abuse or extreme disadvantage. Now in the UK they continue to experience trauma due to the UK's hostile immigration system. Through our work, we aim to reduce their stresses and support their wellbeing.

Creating wellbeing boxes for the women we work with can be a great activity for your students to work on as part of their fundraising and their PHSE curriculum.

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Afrocats dance-a-thon

Cultural dance and creative movement feature in all of our programmes. We use dance to warm up at the beginning of sessions and as part of our wellbeing work.

Creating an Afrocats dance-a-thon is a fun way for students to fundraise for us and keep fit!

Students can gather donations and pledges ahead of the dance-a-thon from friends, neighbours and family. They will need to decide if people will donate to support a dancer or for the amount of time dancing.

We will put together a cultural playlist to kick off your event, and then all you need to do is make sure everyone has fun!

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Culturally appropriate food pack

We support asylum seekers and their families with culturally appropriate food parcels.

It costs us approximately £1100 to provide African, Asian and Middle Eastern packages of fresh vegetables, spices and supermarket vouchers for the families we work with.

You will need:

- Food donations or volunteer shoppers
- A location to pack food parcels

We will give you:

- A full breakdown of how many items to buy
- Advice and support for running a successful pack

Middle Eastern food parcels:

- Aubergine
- Tomato
- Onion
- Potatoes
- Curry powder (medium)
- Tumeric

African food parcels:

- Yam
- Sweet potato
- Onions
- Sweet peppers
- Tomato
- Plantain
- Scotch Bonnet

Asian food parcels:

- Green chillies
- Okra
- Aubergine
- Ghee
- Rice

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Supporting your curriculum

Partnering with Afrocats can support your PHSE, citizenship and geography curriculums. Through your lessons and fundraising for Afrocats, you can help your students to explore topics such as migration, culture shock and displacement. Introducing these themes can help students to develop respect and empathy.

Writing a letter home

Students imagine a situation when they would have to flee their homes to another country. Get them to write a letter home imagining what it might be like arriving somewhere new. How do they feel? What are their hopes and their fears?

Guess the country

Select countries from the UN's refugee situations data, and see if your students recognise the shape of the country. Can they draw the flags for these countries? Get the students to research the terrains and climates of these countries and use them as a discussion point for why people might have to leave their country.

Cultural food bingo

Split the class into three groups. Get ask each group to research national dishes from Africa, South East Asia and the Middle East. Now get the students to add the facts they learnt about the dishes to bingo cards. At the end of the lesson play a round of bingo so everyone can learn about the different dishes.

Black history month and refugee week

Mark these awareness weeks in your school calendar across your lesson plans.

Magdalen's journey

Our CEO has her own story of migration and culture shock. Magdalen can present her story to form groups or at a whole school assembly.
